Changes in IgA-Targeted Microbiota following Fecal Transplantation for **Recurrent** Clostridioides difficile Infection

Secretory immunoglobulin A (IgA) interacts with intestinal microbiota and promotes mucosal homeostasis. IgA-bacteria interactions are altered during inflammatory diseases, but how these interactions are shaped by bacterial, host, and environmental factors remains unclear. The authors utilized IgA-SEQ to profile IgAbound fecal bacteria in 48 recurrent *Clostridioides difficile* patients before and after successful fecal microbiota transplantation to gain further insight. While single agent immune checkpoint blockade has proved relatively ineffective in unselected metastatic castration resistant prostate cancer (mCRPC), the authors highlight its potential for eliciting potent anti-tumour responses when combined with agents that target the uniquely immunosuppressive tumour microenvironment of mCRPC.
